Knob Creek Cabin Wins Hampton Inn Save-A-Landmark Program Vote

Over a period of eighteen days, voters across the country cast nearly 45,000 online votes to elect nine landmarks for restoration through Hampton Hotels' Save-A-Landmark program. By the end of the voting period, Kentucky's Abraham Lincoln Boyhood Home at Knob Creek was named a winner.



Since the Save-A-Landmark program began in 2000, Hampton Hotels has been dedicated to preserving America's historical, fun, and cultural landmarks that exist along our country's treasured highways. Since the program's inception, Hampton Hotels has dedicated thousands of hours and more than \$3.5 million to refurbish forty-one landmarks. The program aims to refurbish a landmark in each of the 50 states by the end of 2010.

This year's program theme is "All-American Landmarks," and with that theme, Hampton Hotels hopes to pay homage to landmarks that celebrate the diverse definitions of what it means to be an American.

Past winners in the program have received volunteer service from staff members from local Hampton Inn sites for one work-day and funding for supplies for that day. Hampton Hotels then presents each site with a check for ongoing maintenance, totaling between \$25,000 and \$35,000. Including volunteer hours, total funding from the program ranges between \$40,000 and \$50,000.

Projects proposed for improvement at the Knob Creek site include replacing a split-rail fence that surrounds the site and developing a trail to link the interpretive garden, which includes crops and herbs from the frontier period, to an older trail that overlooks the entire Knob Creek Valley. If developed, that trail will unite the restored buildings to the site's natural resources, and will include signage to describe historically significant events that took place at Knob Creek.

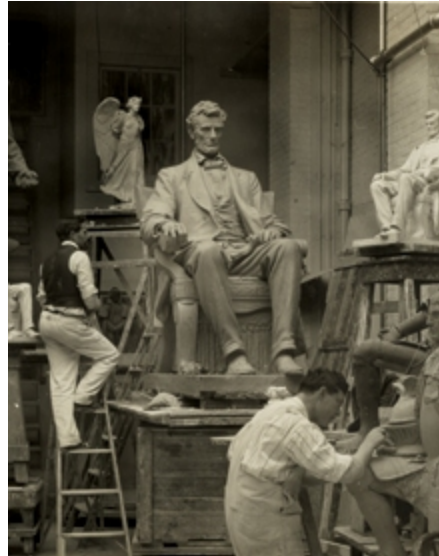
